## “STATEMENT FROM THE SESSION OF THE CHURCH”

In an ongoing effort to keep you, the individual members of our congregation informed regarding the happenings within PCUSA and the Fellowship of Presbyterians, the Session of First Presbyterian, Longview, would like you to know about two things:

**First**, the Session of FPC Longview wishes to make the following statement: We are profoundly disappointed by the change described in Amendment 10-A because it seriously weakens Scripture as a principle

authority, source and norm for faith, and as a result, it provides for the elimination of the “fidelity and chastity” clause within the ordination standards. We are saddened because we agreed with the biblical standards which require fidelity in marriage and chastity in singleness. We are further disheartened by the divisiveness that this has caused both in our denomination and within our local church walls. In the meantime this church will continue to adhere to the previous ordination standards that were in place before the amendment was ratified.

**Secondly**, the Session would like to report on the trip made by two of our members and both our pastors who attended the initial meeting of the Fellowship of Presbyterians (or the FOP) held at the end of August in Minneapolis. These four people included: Jack Moore, Jill Smead, Reverend Jonathan Jehorek and Reverend Shelley Kral. They were part of a group totalling 1,900 attendees representing over 800 different congregations. During the 3 day meeting the entire group was split into small table discussions groups of about 8 people or so. Each table contained a diverse group of perspectives. The theme of the meeting was: “Connect where possible; differentiate where necessary”.

During the meeting, the Fellowship of Presbyterians presented four “tiers” or levels of differentiation. Conceptually, each tier can be used to describe a church’s continued level of affiliation with PCUSA. These tiers range from continued membership within PCUSA to various levels of differentiation, including hypothetically

the possibility of ultimate separation from PCUSA. At this time, there are no details to report on any of these tiers and further discussion would be strictly speculation.

At the meeting the FOP gathered information and plans to provide more details to us later this month. Their follow-up may include more specifics about each tier and possibly a Statement of Theological Standards. Then, in January of 2012 a second meeting will take place in Orlando, Florida. It should be noted, that any future recommendation regarding the Fellowship of Presbyterians will be subject to the outcome of future meetings and will be done in the most Presbyterian of ways: being done both “decently and in order”.

The bottom line is that we ask you to please “stay tuned”. We will gladly share with you more information as it becomes available over time. To that end, our Session has established an Information Task Force to whom you may address any questions you may have in this regard. That task force includes the four people previously mentioned who attended the meeting in addition to David Brahbam, Steve Mason, Nancy Murray and Carla Szafran. Again, we ask you to please bear with us and stay tuned.

Meanwhile, please join us in prayer for our denomination, for our Presbytery, for our Session, for our pastors, for our congregation as a whole and for our members individually. May our actions, words and deeds be to the glory of God.

## WOMEN'S RETREAT AT CAMP GILMONT

"What Is Beautiful" is the title of the annual retreat for women on February 3-5, 2012. Betsy Lockhart, MDiv Pastor, Worship Curator and Storyteller will be the retreat leader:

*"Many times after telling a story I have been asked, 'Is that really true' or 'Did that really happen?' And my answer is always the same, 'Yes and Yes.' When we try to speak of our God and our faith we often find our words to be lacking. Our words fall short of the profound mystery that is God's love for us. To remedy this lack-of-words we tell stories. Everyone has a story. Our stories are beautiful? This retreat will dance around the question, 'What is beautiful?'"*

Total cost of the event is \$155 and includes tuition, cabin housing for 2 nights and all meals. 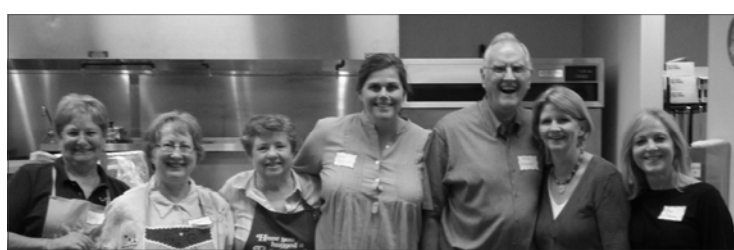
