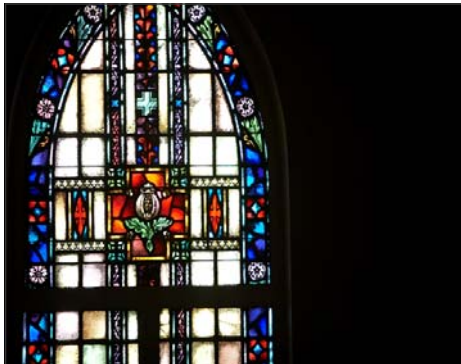

"HAPPY BIRTHDAY PRESBYTERIAN CHILDREN'S CENTER"



Mrs. Martha Armstrong once gathered together a group of volunteers each Friday morning from 9 a.m. till noon and, for \$1 per family, mothers of our church could drop off their little ones for the morning. In March of 1979, the Christian Nurture Committee began to explore the possibility of a "school" for our church. In August of that year, a 2-day-a-week Mother's Day Out program began and in the next two years, it had grown to serve 85 children a day 5 days a week. The present Presbyterian Children's Center has now completed 30 full years of service and is beginning its 31st year of service [This information is thanks to "Mother Nature" aka Caroline Perry who was here from the beginning!]

The PCC is a very fine educational facility for children from infants through Kindergarten. We believe in education and children. Curricula is based on encouraging children to be individuals, to inquire, to create, to cope with feelings and ideas, and through all these things to learn, to grow, and to achieve. In addition to their regular classroom activities students are involved in music/drama, science/nature, technology, and Chapel. From time to time, classroom learning is enhanced through field trip experiences, visitors to our school, and special programs.

An outreach of the Church, the PCC is licensed to serve 110 children and is currently near capacity. In celebration of the Center, we invite you to join us for a "Come and Go" birthday party on August 31, 2011, between the hours of 3 and 4 p.m. in Grace Hall. We wish you well and hope to see you at the party!

- Wednesday night Bible study leaders are needed for the 6th grade boys.

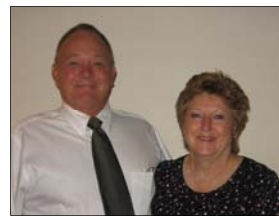
FALL 2011 WEDNESDAY NIGHT DINNERS
