A GLIMPSE INTO THE YOUTH OF FPC LONGVIEW

"The Youth of today are lazy, irresponsible, and apathetic." This statement is a misnomer of youth or at least of our youth at FPC. Our youth are highly involved in their schools, communities, and in their church. Before the school year began, they were serving on Indian reservations in New Mexico and in Oklahoma repairing roofs, painting homes, hanging drywall, and ministering to the people of their respective locations. Our youth proved by their actions that they are not typical.

The youth group of FPC is composed of students from numerous schools around the area. They are involved in every sport offered, numerous clubs, bands, drill teams, majorettes, and much more. While maintaining an active involvement in extra-curricular activities, they are in the top of their classes. In 2010, we have a number of our youth graduating in the top ten of

their class. And we have students that are among the first to be accepted into the International Baccalaureate program at Longview High. The youth of FPC are leaders in every area of the schools they attend.

FPC youth dispel the notion of being apathetic by their involvement in the community, in our local church, and ultimately in the body of Christ. They are involved in Sunday morning worship, Youth Fellowship, Youth Choir, Youth Band, Church School, and Bible studies. They also take a month off from their own Sunday school class to teach the children's WORM rotation. Our youth attend junior high and senior high conferences to grow in Christ and in fellowship with one another.

Furthermore, FPC youth are involved in activities outside the walls of the church building by being active in the Newgate

ministry, raising money to feed the homeless, delivering food to the needy, Christmas caroling to shut-ins, and mission trips. As school comes to an end and people are planning their vacations, our youth are preparing to travel to Lake Jackson, Texas, and to Lima, Peru, to repair homes and an orphanage and to minister to the elderly and to children.

Our youth are a gift from God. They are setting an example for the church to follow. As a whole, they are far from lazy, irresponsible, or apathetic. They do have their struggles like the rest of us and they need our prayers and guidance. But they are striving as best they know how to grow in Christ and to give Him all the glory in everything they do. I am proud of our youth and I am proud to be called their director.
